The Healing Place of Wake County is a non-profit 501 (c) (3) recovery and rehabilitation facility for homeless people with alcohol and other drug addictions. The Men's Facility opened its doors in 2001, and the Women's Facility began operation in 2006. During its operation, The Healing Place has provided more than 500,000 beds of shelter to homeless men and women. The nonprofit has also provided thousands of recovery classes and meetings. Remarkably, over 65% of the graduates from the program are still sober one year after program completion. The Healing Place of Wake County is built on the principles of the highly successful Healing Place in Louisville KY, which received the 1998 US Department of Health Resources and Service Administration "Models That Work Award" in recognition of the success of the program.
